### *Who Should Attend?*

Practicing primary care pediatricians, pediatricians in training, family practitioners, pediatric nurse practitioners and allied health professionals.

### *Goal*

The goal of Timely Topics in Pediatrics—2008 is to improve the expertise of practicing primary care pediatricians in the following topics pertaining to the health care of children.

- 1) Current management of hypercholesterolemia in pediatrics
- 2) Chest pain and sudden death in the Pediatric athlete, screening and evaluation
- 3) Caring for the NICU graduate
- 4) Pediatric medical malpractice, preventative not defensive medicine.

### *Objectives*

At the end of the program the participant will be able to:

- Current management of hypercholesterolemia – Understand current guidelines for screening, appropriate follow up and testing. They will learn the available, evidence based options for treatment and the known consequences of inadequately treated hypercholesterolemia.
- Screening and evaluation for chest pain and risk for sudden death in the pediatric athlete – Understand the most common conditions that might cause chest pain or risk for sudden death in the pediatric athlete. Learn appropriate pre-participation screening measures and when to recommend or refer for further diagnostic evaluation. Learn about how to appropriately assess the athlete who presents with complaints of chest pain, what appropriate initial testing is required and when referral or consultation is needed.
- Caring for the NICU graduate – Understand the common health profile of the NICU graduate including most common problems by organ system. Learn appropriate health maintenance algorithms for well NICU graduates as well as algorithms for common high risk conditions such as retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). Learn about available community resources including the Infant Development Program, pediatric specialists and hospital based services.
- Pediatric medical malpractice, preventative not defensive medicine – Understand the common conditions which can result in an action alleging medical malpractice. Learn appropriate communication and documentation skills to practice good pediatric medicine. Learn techniques to communicate with families when negative or unforeseen problems arise during the care of children.

#### **L. Richard Fried, Jr.**

Mr. Fried was admitted to the bar in Arizona in 1966 and in Hawaii in 1968. In 1969 he was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit; in 1977 the U.S. Supreme Court, U.S. Court of International Trade and U.S. Tax Court. In 1978 he was appointed to the U.S. Claims Court and District Court for the Northern Mariana Islands.

Mr. Fried received his LL.B. from the University of Arizona in 1966. He is a member of the Hawaii State, Federal and American (Member, Tort and Insurance Practice Section) Bar Associations.

#### **Charles R. Neal, Jr., M.D., PhD, FAAP— (Member AAP-Hawaii)**

Dr. Neal is Associate Professor, Department of Pediatrics Division of Neonatal Medicine and Adjunct Associate Professor, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine. He is Board Certified in both Pediatrics and Neonatal and Perinatal Medicine. Dr. Neal also conducts scientific research.

Dr. Neal received his degrees from the University of Michigan in 1991 and completed his residency at the University of California, San Francisco in 1994. In 1998 he completed a Fellowship in Neonatal and Perinatal Medicine at the University of Michigan Medical Center, followed by academic appointments.
